



However, you can report the peddler/salesperson to the police department if at any time you feel harassed, have asked the salesperson to leave and they remain on your property, or feel threatened or endangered.

You may also call the police if you have posted a sign (directions on the flip side of this brochure) on your door stating you do not allow peddlers/ salespersons at your door, and you are still being bothered by door-to-door peddlers.

If you need to contact the police, call 651-767-0640.



To keep peddlers from your door, you can purchase a sign that says:

No Trespassing or Peddlers and Solicitors Prohibited or No Peddlers or Solicitors

You also have the option of making your own sign. Print must be at least

48 points

and the sign must measure no less than four inches by four inches.

If you are considering posting a sign on your residence the print would have to be at least this size (you may use this sign if you wish):

H. Peddling and Soliciting:

- 1. The practice of going house-to-house, door-to-door, business-to-business, street-to-street, or any other type of place-to-place, for the purposes of offering for sale or obtaining, or attempting to obtain, orders for goods, wares, products, merchandise, other personal property or services may be declared to be a public nuisance and ordinance violation if conducted in the following manner:
 - a. Obstructing the free flow of either vehicular or pedestrian traffic on any street alley, sidewalk or other public right-of-way;
 - b. Conducting business in a way as to create a threat to the health, safety and welfare of any individual or the general public;
 - c. Conducting business before 7:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m.
 - d. Making any false or misleading statements about the product or service being offered, including untrue statements of endorsement;
 - e. Remaining on the property of another when requested to leave, or to otherwise conduct business in a manner a reasonable person would find obscene, threatening, intimidating or abusive.
- 2. Entering the property of another, unless invited to do so by the property owner or tenant, for the purpose of conducting business as a peddler or solicitor when the property is marked with a sign or placard at least four inches long and four inches wide with print at least 48 point in size stating, "No Trespassing," or "No Peddlers or Solicitors," or "Peddlers and Solicitors Prohibited" or other comparable statement. Removing, defacing or otherwise tampering with any sign or placard under this section by a person other than the property owner or tenant.
