RE: Brenner Pond Drainage Improvement Project Approved

Dear Property Owner:

Last December, the City of Roseville sent letters to your neighborhood that discussed proposed drainage improvements for Brenner Pond. The City Council recently approved the project to move forward during the 2020 construction season. This project is tentatively scheduled to begin June 1, 2020. The city acquired the lot between 800 Brenner Ave and 812 Brenner Ave in 2011 due to local drainage concerns. To help mitigate the drainage issues, the city is going to re-grade portions of the parcel to create an iron enhanced sand filtration basin. The improved basin will provide additional storage and treatment and eliminate standing water on the parcel. The improvements will reduce drainage concerns in the area and reduce overall long-term maintenance costs to the city.

Additionally, the city is currently performing significant tree maintenance on this parcel. In order to complete this work, a majority of the trees on the site will be removed. Removing the trees will allow the parcel to be graded properly so that the site can drain adequately and allow the city to install a filtration basin, which will provide additional treatment. Removal of the trees will eliminate some of the concerns we have received from neighbors about hazardous trees and falling limbs on this parcel. The new basin will be added into the city's comprehensive stormwater best management practice (BMP) maintenance list and maintained once a month, or as needed, to ensure a well-functioning stormwater system.
